## THEMED BOOK PACKS

• From "Things that Go!" to "ABC's," families love discovering new titles that convey their favorite things. Build & circulate "themed book packs"

### **RECHARGE YOUR 1,000 BOOKS BEFORE KINDERGARTEN PROGRAM**

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- In addition to print reading logs, give families options to email or digitally submit logs by moving program to a virtual platform such as READsquared/Beanstack.
- Shift to fewer/combined prizes so they are easier to hand out and can be given out with curbside orders. (A small prize every 100 books, like a pencil)
- Push out 1,000 Books tips and reminders on your social media, along the lines of "Tell us what book you and your little one are enjoying this week!" to try to build a sense of community among those doing the program.
- Highlight accomplishments on social media!



# **FAVORITE BOOK CHARACTER HUNT**

- Includes brief explanation of craft & crafting materials in a popcorn bag.






Take it Away--Take and Make Ideas

Next time a good snow storm is predicted for your community, put out an impromptu snowman challenge. Have them submit their "best" snow creation photos to the library.



## NUTRITIONAL AND PERSONAL NEEDS

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
